

Quarterly Activity & Achievements



Highlights

- Cut the cost of the Commission's mediation service by almost half to help small businesses and landlords resolve disputes quickly and cheaply. Applying for mediation is free
- · Published a new guide to the Commission's mediation service
- Delivered a <u>report</u> to the NSW Government on the challenges small businesses have in obtaining appropriate insurance, making a series of recommendations to improve access



- Was successful in advocating for a \$10,000 grant for businesses in Kangaroo Valley impacted by flood-related road closures
- The Commission successfully advocated for changes to NSW Government procurement processes, making it easier for co-operative and mutual enterprises to register to sell to the Government



- Published the 2022 update to the Commission's <u>Retail Tenancy Guide</u>, a comprehensive overview of everything retail lease holders and landlords need to know when starting or ending a lease or resolving a lease dispute
- Published a <u>factsheet</u> on how small businesses can get a better deal on card payments fees
- Made a <u>submission</u> to the ACCC's Regional Mobile Infrastructure Inquiry on the telecommunications challenges faced by small businesses in the regions
- Lodged a <u>submission</u> to the Home Building Compensation Reform discussion paper from the State Insurance Regulatory Authority, outlining the challenges for small business in this sector



- <u>Surveyed</u> more than 1,800 NSW small businesses over three surveys to understand how confident businesses are about their future and the key challenges they face
- 24 consultations conducted with small businesses and industry organisations as part of the Commission's Business Insights Initiative (BII)



 Conducted 142 mediation sessions to help small businesses resolve disputes and managed 460 new applications for mediation
